### DO NOT CALL 911 FOR:

- A joke
- Directions
- Power outages (call power company)
- Telephone information
- To burn something (contact DEQ)
- Water problems (call water provider)

### How can you help us?

- Make sure your address is seen visibly from the street during the day and at night.
- For safety reasons, when driving always pull to the right to make room for all emergency vehicles.
- For non-emergencies contact us at our Administrative Center, 5030 S. Camino Verde or (520) 883-4341. Office hours are Mondays-Fridays (except holidays) from 8:00am-5:00pm.

### Did you know?

- Our firefighters are crossed trained with emergency medical skills. That's why you may see both fire trucks and ambulances responding to incidents.
- It is faster to call 911 from your location than to drive to a fire station. Emergency vehicles may be in transit and not in the station at the time of your call.
- Drexel Heights Fire District offers many non-emergency and community outreach services. These programs are listed on the reverse side of this card.

## Public Education Programs

Call our Administration Center (520) 883-4341 for more details on these programs:

**Babysitting Classes\***– Offered to 12-16 year olds during the summer. Includes CPR, first aid, child care, fire extinguishers and résumé classes. Registration required. (fee)

**Bike Safety**– Helmet fittings at our Admin Center. Bike Rodeo event offered over rodeo weekend.

**Child Safety Seats\***– FREE car seats and booster seats to District residents. FREE seat inspections. (Call for an appointment 883-4341 ext 250).

**Characterization Program**– Presented during Fire Prevention Month (October) to participating schools. Includes fire and life safety messages through music and character performances.

**Community Safety Fair**– Offered the last Saturday in April, 10am-2pm, FREE public entrance (location TBA).

**CPR & First Aid Classes\***– Presented to the public monthly and generally on the first Saturday. Contact our Admin Center for registration details. (fee)

**Drowning Prevention**– FREE Water Watcher Tags available to remind families about having a designated child watcher around the water.

**Fire Safety Trailer**– Schools can tour the trailer to reinforce fire safety behaviors. Based on availability.

**Home Safety\***– FREE smoke detector and fire extinguisher as well as home safety tips to any District resident. (Call for an appointment 883-4341 ext 228).

**Juvenile Firesetter Intervention**– Safety education offered to children involved with setting fires and their families. Call for an appointment.

**Mini-Muster Field Events**– Presented in the spring to second graders at participating schools.

**Senior Citizen Fire Academy**– Participants 55 and older will receive fire safety and fall prevention information while meeting the District's first responders. Registration required. (fee)

**Vial of Life**– FREE vial and form to record medical information and have available for emergencies.
